**THE GAMM TEAMS UP WITH AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL AND RICH
TO ENGAGE PUBLIC IN TIMELY TALK SURROUNDING TOPICAL THEATER**

PAWTUCKET, RI (January 29, 2007) — **The Sandra Feinstein-Gamm Theatre** (The Gamm), with the support of **Amnesty International USA** and **Rhode Island Council for the Humanities**, is pleased to offer audiences four opportunities to discuss ***Enhanced Interrogation Techniques***—a one-of-a-kind production dealing with human rights and torture—with the people behind today's headlines. Special guests include **human rights advocates, lawyers** and a **former US Army interrogator**. These events are **FREE** and open to the public. Show attendance is encouraged, but **not required** to participate.

Enhanced Interrogation Techniques is composed of four one-act plays by three greats of the modern theater, produced as a single show. Alternately hilarious, disturbing and inspirational, the mini-masterpieces include: ***A Hand Witch of the Second Stage*** by award-winning playwright Peter Barnes; ***One for the Road*** and ***Press Conference*** by 2005 Nobel Laureate Harold Pinter; and ***Catastrophe*** by theater of the absurd pioneer Samuel Beckett. ***Enhanced Interrogation Techniques*** runs from **January 25 through February 25** at The Gamm Theatre, 172 Exchange St., Pawtucket, RI.
